Response to the Santa Barbara County Grand Jury 2024-2025 Report "Female Inmates at Santa Barbara County Jails"

**Findings and Recommendations** 

Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office: 60 Days

Finding(s): 1, 2 and 3

Recommendation(s): 1, 2 and 3

**Finding 1**: To their detriment, female inmates have fewer work opportunities than male inmates in preparing them for life outside jail.

Sheriff's Office Response: Agree.

**Recommendation 1**: The Grand Jury recommends that the Sheriff's Office provide work detail opportunities to female inmates at both of the County's jails in crews that allow for a more flexible number of women. To be implemented by January 1, 2026.

**Sheriff's Office Response**: Will be implemented, with an implementation schedule.

The Sheriff's Office has recently codified work requirements for incarcerated persons based on job performance factors, which take into account a person's security level, their physical limitations, and disability accommodations. All work crew assignments within the jail facilities are voluntary. Due to the relatively small number of incarcerated women within the Main Jail (54 females as of 8/4/2025), it is very difficult to assign them to work in larger crews that exist within the kitchen and laundry. Mixing incarcerated men and women within a jail setting creates risk and cannot be safely accomplished with current staffing levels. In the past, the Sheriff's Office has attempted to utilize a female kitchen crew at the Northern Branch Jail. However, this effort was difficult to maintain due a to lack of eligible participants willing to volunteer. Nevertheless, the Sheriff's Office will evaluate various existing work assignments with a view to offering them to incarcerated women. This will be implemented before January 1, 2026.

**Finding 2:** College classes are not available at the Main Jail to the same extent that they are available at the Northern Branch Jail, depriving women at the Main Jail of equivalent educational opportunities.

**Sheriff's Office Response**: Disagree partially with an explanation. The Sheriff's Office has partnered with Santa Barbara City College (SBCC) for several years to provide educational opportunities to incarcerated persons while they serve their time in the Main Jail. Unlike Allan Hancock College, which provides educational services at our Northern Branch Jail, SBCC requires at least seventeen participants to be enrolled in any class that they teach within the Main Jail. Due to this restriction, the Sheriff's Office must coordinate closely with SBCC to offer classes that allow for persons of different classifications. gender and other safety concerns to be able to participate in college courses on a rotating basis. Interested female inmates are being offered the opportunity to attend the next course offering in Fall 2025. At this time, SBCC is not able to offer additional courses. However, the Sheriff's Office will continue to explore additional educational opportunities with SBCC and other educational organizations. The Sheriff's Office also offers several online educational opportunities through our communication services contract with ViaPath, which are free and available to everyone incarcerated within the Santa Barbara County jail system.

**Recommendation 2**: The Grand Jury recommends that the Sheriff's Office expand current educational and vocational course offerings at the Main Jail in cooperation with local colleges. To be implemented by January 1, 2026.

**Sheriff's Office Response**: It will not be implemented with an explanation of why. Please see the response to Finding 2.

**Finding 3**: Women inmates are receptive to therapy and self-improvement groups. While the Sheriff's Treatment Program is available at both of the County's jails, the activities provided by community organizations – such as yoga, book clubs, and mutual support recovery groups – vary between the two facilities.

# Sheriff's Office Response: Agree

**Recommendation 3**: The Grand Jury recommends that the Sheriff's Office expand its efforts to make more community-provided self-improvement and therapy programs available to educate and motivate inmates at both jails, including the women.

**Sheriff's Office Response**: It will not be implemented with an explanation of why.

The Sheriff's Office is always interested in expanding educational and vocational programs to persons incarcerated within its jails, whenever feasible. The Main Jail's design makes it difficult and cost prohibitive at times to provide additional programs. The Sheriff's Office partners with numerous community providers, volunteers, and local community colleges to provide programs and activities that are beneficial to those who are incarcerated. To do so, we depend on their willingness and ability to provide such services. Many of these activities also require supervision by custody deputies, which we cannot always prioritize staffing resources to accomplish. Once construction is completed at the Northern Branch Jail to replace Main Jail beds with more adequate program spaces available, the Sheriff's Office will be able to offer more self-improvement and therapeutic programs to both men and women.
